## Take Action on SGR Reform!

The U.S. House of Representatives approved (392-37 vote) the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 (H.R. 2) on March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015. It moved to the U.S. Senate, however the Senate failed to bring to a vote legislation to repeal the flawed Medicare Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) formula before leaving for April recess early this morning. Because the Senate failed to enact permanent SGR repeal legislation before the March 31 deadline and a 21% physician payment cut will take effect April 1, 2015.

For more than a decade, the sustainable growth rate (SGR) formula used to set Medicare physician payments has caused instability and uncertainty for urology practices around the country. Despite this recent inaction, momentum is gaining on finally achieving a permanent SGR repeal. It is imperative that the Senate pass this critical legislation now. Please contact your lawmakers today to urge them to support this bill immediately upon their return to Washington on April 13. They need to hear from you!

Please take a moment to share with your lawmaker the toll that endless SGR patches and economic uncertainty takes on your practice and patients, and encourage them to support H.R. 2, the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act. Take action now!
